



Weekly Report (September 15-21, 2023) on the Third Tranche of Stellantis Share Buyback Program

AMSTERDAM, September 22, 2023 - Stellantis N.V. (“Stellantis” or the “Company”) announced today that pursuant to its Third Tranche of the Share Buyback Program announced on September 11, 2023, covering up to €500 million to be executed in the open market during the period between September 11, 2023 and December 11, 2023, it has repurchased the following common shares in the period between September 15 up to and including September 21, 2023:
